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Assigning significance

- The following questions can be used or adapted to help students decide on the significance of aspects of the past, for example people, events, developments or sites.
- These questions refer to people and events. However ideas, discoveries, developments, sites or other aspects of the past could be substituted.

Questions to determine significance	Yes or No To what extent?	Notes
Did the person or event bring about an important change?		
Did the person or event affect a large number of people?		
Were some people affected more than others?		
Were the effects positive or negative?		
How deeply did the person or event affect peoples' lives?		
Were effects widespread?		
Were effects long-lasting?		
Was the person or event commemorated in the past? What form of commemoration?		
Is the person or event commemorated today? What form of commemoration?		
Was the person or event important for our understanding of the past?		
Was the person or event important for our understanding of the present?		
Has the importance of the person or event changed over time?
